Wood Burning in New Jersey



Wood is a renewable energy source, however, burning wood can significantly impact public health and welfare. Wood smoke emits fine particulate matter (PM2.5) and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), which can cause lung irritation, cancer, and premature death.
