Risk Reduction Areas Designated in Manville

A state-led, risk and resilience-centered decision framework has been established to drive the use of post-lda recovery investments in Manville to support the state's hazard mitigation priorities of saving life first and protecting property.



The Risk Reduction Area policy is a multiagency decision, relying on predictive <u>flood mapping</u> by Rutgers University; input from state agencies, including the Office of Emergency Management, Department of Environmental Protection, and Department of Community Affairs; and an acquisition action plan Manville crafted in 2018.

Ensuring Flood Buyout Participants Relocate to Safe, Affordable Local Housing: New Presentation

In July, DEP Blue Acres and DCA Smart Move presented at the annual Columbia University Managed Retreat Conference.

Program representatives focused on the crosswalk between the Blue Acres buyout program and the Smart Move new housing development program, calling out policy challenges, solutions, and opportunities that highlight the intersection between buyouts and housing and specifically how Smart Move

make informed decisions about climate resilience. We coordinate across DEP programs and state agency partners to plan for the climate change impacts and hazards that will affect our communities, businesses, infrastructure, and natural resources.

been damaged in flooding events, such as those whose homes were destroyed or damaged when the remnants of Tropical Storm Ida impacted New Jersey in September 2021.

Preparedness: Blue Acres contributes to New Jersey's Climate Change Resilience Strategy through a proactive approach to guide state acquisition of lands that increases host community resilience through the strategic acquisition of lands that have been damaged, or may be prone to future damage, due to sea-level rise, storms, or storm-related flooding, or that may buffer or protect other lands from such damage.

The Blue Acres website includes a webpage for homeowners interested in selling their flood-prone home and learning more about the buyout process steps.

ICYMI: Inland Flood Rule Published July 17

The rule updates New Jersey's existing flood hazard and stormwater regulations by replacing outdated precipitation estimates with modern data that account for observed and <u>projected</u> increases in rainfall. These changes will help reduce flooding from stormwater runoff and increase the resiliency of new



developments located in flood-prone inland areas.

Also in connection with the rule, DEP launched New Jersey's <u>Flood Indicator Tool</u> to aid the public in gauging flood risk and to provide a visual display of flood indicators on or near specific parcels.
