### What is CCI?

The Community Collaborative Initiative (CCI) is a partnership between the NJDEP, local governments, and community leaders to transform overburdened communities into sustainable and economically thriving areas by addressing environmental issues like brownfields. CCI started in Camden, turning contaminated and unused spaces into community assets through collaboration and grassroots efforts, and has since expanded to 12 cities across New Jersey. By working closely with local partners, CCI helps communities clean up environmental hazards, boost economic development, and revitalize neighborhoods.





#### **Program Initiatives**

The Community Collaborative Initiative includes programs like improving urban parks, enhancing water quality through stormwater management projects, and promoting the cleaning up of brownfield sites. They also assist communities in finding funding and grants for environmental projects, focusing on air quality monitoring and lead remediation in older buildings. Recently, high-tech surveillance has been introduced to monitor and deter illegal dumping, enhancing efforts to address this environmental issue.

### Mission

CCI is a partnership between state and local governments and community groups focused on promoting sustainable, resilient development in Environmental Justice communities. CCI works alongside local leaders to revitalize neighborhoods, foster equitable economic growth, and enhance public health outcomes. By leveraging state resources and collaborating with community members, CCI ensures the state's best talents are engaged in local progress. Together, these efforts support the Governor's mission to build a more vibrant, equitable, and resilient New Jersey.
