

The Water Supply **Advisory Council**

The Water Supply Advisory Council (WSAC) was formed pursuant to the Water Supply Management Act (N.J.S.A. 58:1A-1 et.seq.) to advise the Commissioner of the NJDEP in the New Jersey Statewide Water Supply Planning process and other water supply topics. The members of the WSAC are nominated by the Governor and confirmed by the New Jersey State Senate. The WSAC consists of seven members that represent the following interests: Industry, Agriculture, Residential, Academic, Public Water Company, Private Water Company and Environment.

Summary Statement




Reclaimed wastewater, which was once considered a waste for disposal, is now a resource desired by commercial entities, municipalities, county parks, and various recreational developments. N.J.A.C. 7:14A-2.1 established a responsibility for the Department to encourage and promote Reclaimed Water for Beneficial Reuse (RWBR) and water conservation. RWBR involves taking what was once considered waste product, giving it a high degree of treatment and using the resulting high-quality reclaimed water for beneficial uses. The importance of RWBR programs first came to light during the drought of 1999 and again during the drought of 2002, when the state experienced firsthand the importance of protecting and conserving our potable water supplies.



An important component of the New Jersey Water Supply Master Plan concerns RWBR. As a result, the Clean Water Council and the Water Supply Advisory Council, will hold its annual public hearing on the subject of RWBR.


