## RE: RECOMMENDATIONS DERIVED FROM THE CLEAN WATER COUNCIL'S 2008 PUBLIC HEARING ON NEW JERSEY'S WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

Dear Acting Commissioner Mauriello:

On behalf of the New Jersey Clean Water Council (CWC), I am pleased to report to you that in accordance with N.J.S.A. 58:25-12, the CWC conducted a public hearing on December 8, 2008 on the subject of New Jersey's Water Infrastructure – Sustainable Funding. The objective of the hearing was to hear public testimony on water infrastructure financing, specifically the issues of funding for capital investments, rehabilitation, operations and maintenance for water supply, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure.

The Council formulated five questions for public consideration and response. Specifically, the Council sought input and examples that address the following questions:

- 1) Funding for Urban Infrastructure;
- 2) Sustainable Pricing and Management;
- 3) Maintenance of Adequate Local Reserves
- 4) Financing Mechanisms for Stormwater Management
- 5) Financial Incentives for Innovative Technologies

During the hearing, the CWC heard from experts who had been invited to address the issue from their diverse perspectives. Gary Sondermeyer, Director of Operations, provided the NJDEP perspective; Michael Curley, Executive Director of the International Center for Environmental Finance, provided a national perspective; James A. Hanlon, Director, EPA's Office of Water, provided EPA's perspective and Edward J. McManimon, III, Partner, McManimon & Scotland, provided the local government perspective. Following these presentations the CWC then heard verbal public testimony or received written testimony from 17 members of the public.

The recommendations attached to this letter summarize the most important ideas identified at the hearing and subsequent CWC member discussions.
