### **Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program**

**One planning grant, three deliverables over 4 years** 



Phase 2

\$4.6 Billion available in competitive implementation grants

to carry out the greenhouse gas reduction measures proposed in the climate action plans.


### New Jersey's PCAP Basics

#### Near term roadmap for statewide emissions reductions

#### Key elements of NJDEP's PCAP:

- Updated Greenhouse Gas Inventory for 2021.
- Identifies and quantifies specific measures to reduce GHG emissions.
- Assesses the authority to implement the measures.
- Evaluates federal funding opportunities to support implementation.
- Analyzes how measures will benefit low-income and disadvantaged communities.
- Evaluates work force development impacts of plan implementation.



Achieve a 50% reduction in food waste by 2030

Local Gov't Action:	Update district solid waste management plans to include food waste reduction
Local Gov't Action:	Encourage schools to adopt the New Jersey School Food Waste Guidelines and institute a food waste reduction curriculum in K12 schools
Local Gov't Action:	Implement a community-scale reusable food-ware system pilot
Local Gov't Action:	Support food waste recovery systems such as anaerobic digesters and co-digestion of food waste at wastewater treatment facilities

Reduce halogenated gas emissions from refrigeration equipment

# NJDEP Electric School Bus Grant

- Provides up to \$15,000,000 per year (2022-2024) (per P.L. 2022, c.86) to replace diesel school buses with battery-electric school buses
  - \$270k \$350k per award
- Applications Due: May 17, 2024, 5:00 p.m. ET



- Eligible applicants:
  - Schools and school districts that own their buses
    - Includes public, private, charter, and other K-12 schools
  - School bus contractors that provide busing services to schools and school districts
    - School bus contractors must apply in conjunction with a specified school or school district.

### Community Energy Plan Implementation (CEPI) Grants

- Funding up to \$250,000 per award
  - To implement clean energy projects in their respective communities
- Complements Community Energy Planning (CEP) Grant program
  - Both CEP and CEPI grant applications are due by 5/24/24
- 40% of available funding will be awarded to Overburdened Municipalities

### Eligibility

- Applicants must be a New Jersey municipal government
- Must have a completed and adopted *community energy plan* (CEP) *or equivalent plan*.

### All applications must be submitted to <u>community.energy@bpu.nj.gov</u> by 5:00 pm Eastern time on May 24, 2024.



# Community Change Grants

Federal EPA Grant with \$2B available for community-driven pollution solutions and climate resiliency solutions

- For disadvantaged communities
- Track I: Community-Driven Investments for Change
  - Funding Available: \$1.96 billion for approximately 150 awards
  - Per Award Amount: \$10M \$20M each
- Track II: Meaningful Engagement for Equitable Governance
  - Funding Available: \$40M for approximately 20 awards
  - Per Award Amount: \$1M-3M each
- Additional \$200M available for <u>Technical Assistance</u>
- Applications are due now through November 21, 2024, on a rolling basis


# Eligibility

### Applicants


- All applications must include a <u>Lead Applicant</u> & <u>Statutory</u> <u>Partner</u>
- Lead Applicant must be a Community-Based Organization (CBO)
- Statutory Partner can be another CBO, Local Government, Institute of Higher Ed, or Federally Recognized Tribe
- Others can be involved as *collaborating entities* (state gov, additional CBOs and local gov, etc.)

#### Projects

- Must be a *community-identified* project to benefit a Disadvantaged Community (DAC)<sup>1</sup>
- A full list of New Jersey Municipalities that contain a DAC can be found in <u>Appendix 7.4 of NJ's PCAP</u>.
