BEFORE **CARIDAD F. RIGO**, ALJ:

This matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law on February 24, 2010, for determination as a contested case, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 to -15 and N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 to -13.

On or about April 18, 2012, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection filed a Motion to Dismiss Hearing Request because Bedroc & Red had failed to respond or otherwise pursue their alleged claims.

Status conferences were held and at the request of the parties, the matter was scheduled for hearing for May 19, 2012, the matter was adjourned without date because there was no response from respondents.

I have concluded that there is just cause, under all the circumstances, to dismiss this petition with prejudice. I adopt by reference and incorporate hereto the Order of Dismissal of Hearing Request for Failure to Prosecute that the Deputy Attorney General submitted for my signature.

It is **ORDERED** that the matter be deemed dismissed with prejudice for failure to file an appearance and failure to prosecute the hearing requested.

I hereby **FILE** my initial decision with the **COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION** for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the **COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION**, who by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10.
