

Environmental Laboratory Advisory Committee (ELAC) FINAL/REVISED Meeting Minutes December 12, 2024

Administrative Business:

The meeting was called to order at 9:32am by ELAC Chair, Rose Koplin (Accredited). Meeting minutes were taken by Steve Witkowski (Pace). This meeting was held via Microsoft Teams.

The November ELAC Meeting Minutes were approved with a motion by Harvy Klein (Garden State) and seconded by Eileen Synder (Pace).

Environmental Laboratory Certification Program (ELCP): Rachel Ellis (NJDEP-OQA) provided an update.

The latest MUR proposal comment period is currently open. Includes method EPA 1633A for PFAS, method EPA 1628 for 209 PCB congers. With a proposal to move NPDES permits to congeners from Aroclors as permits are renewed over a 5 year period.

During the next renewal cycle ACPLs will be updated with methods from the last finalized MUR and the older versions will be removed. Laboratories will need to be in compliance with the new methods by July 1, 2025.

Rule Amendment: Rachel Ellis (NJDEP-OQA) provided an update.

No additional update. OQA's response has been finalized and is over to legal with a publication date in the NJ register targeted for early 2025.

<u>Proficiency Test (PT) Program:</u> Rachel Ellis (NJDEP-OQA) provided an update.

SCM open, due 12/20 DW opens 1/1/25

The updated FoPT containing PFAS is live for DW, keep in mind that NJ has a longer analyte list. The analytes on the FoPT will have to be analyzed twice per year.
