## **Comparison of New Jersey and EPA Best Management Practices**

The State of New Jersey has adopted 18 Best Management Practices (BMPs) in our Dental Rule. They spell out in detail the minimum requirements for the proper handling and disposal of Amalgam. The USEPA has only adopted two BMPs in their rule. The table below compares these requirements. Yellow highlighted items are equivalent to USEPA BMP 1 and tan equivalent to EPA BMP 2. Some of NJDEPs BMPs are covered elswhere within the USEPA Rule.

## **USEPA BMPs**

- (1) Waste amalgam including, but not limited to, dental amalgam from chair-side traps, screens, vacuum pump filters, dental tools, cuspidors, or collection devices, must not be discharged to a POTW.
- (2) Dental unit water lines, chair-side traps, and vacuum lines that discharge amalgam process wastewater to a POTW must not be cleaned with oxidizing or acidic cleaners, including but not limited to bleach, chlorine, iodine and peroxide that have a pH lower than 6 or greater than 8.
