Program	Description	Eligibility Notes
Traditional Green Acres	Land Acquisition (Planning Incentive, Site-Specific Incentive, Standard, Urban Aid, or Nonprofit) <i>OR</i>	All local governments and nonprofits
	Park Development	All local governments; Nonprofit projects located in an Urban Aid, Densely Populated, or Highly Populated Municipality or a Densely Populated County or that draw over 75% of their users from those areas
Stewardship	Restoration and Protection of Natural Resources and Historic Landscapes	All local governments and nonprofits
Jake's Law Playground Funding	Completely Inclusive Playgrounds	County and municipal governments
Urban Parks	Land Acquisition, Park Development & Historic Preservation	Local government projects located within Overburdened Communities Subject to Adverse Cumulative Stressors within Urban Aid Municipalities

"What can we buy?"

Eligible Acquisition Projects







"Recreation and conservation purposes" means the use of lands for beaches, biological or ecological study, boating, camping, fishing, forests, greenways, hunting, natural areas, parks, playgrounds, protecting historic properties, water reserves, watershed protection, wildlife preserves, active sports, or a similar use for either public outdoor recreation or conservation of natural resources, or both.





"What can we buy?"

Eligible Acquisition Projects (continued)



- Brownfields to Greenfields
- Structures
 - Support outdoor recreation or
 - Demolish (SHPO review)
- Site Suitability
- Ineligible
 - Site of future affordable housing
 - On ROSI or otherwise preserved
 - Road ROWs, Tidelands

Land Cost (CMV)

Technical Report Costs

- Appraisal, Site Investigation, Title, Survey
- Incidental Costs
 - Legal, Engineering, Financial
- Site-Specific Expenses
 - Demolition (after SHPO review), Tenant Relocation, Condemnation

Environmental Justice Acquisitions



Higher grant percentages for Green Acres projects located in or easily accessible from an Overburdened Community Subject to Adverse Cumulative Stressors (ACS/OBC)

Increase of 25%

 Easily accessible = less than ¼ mile away with no barriers to pedestrian access

Matching Funds



Potential matching funds sources:

- Local government open space, capital, or bond funds
- County open space program funding
- \circ $\,$ Other public funding sources $\,$
- Private or corporate donations
- \circ Grants from private foundations
- Green Acres loan funding for local governments -30-year term, 0% interest rate.
- Ineligible match funding:
 - Other GA or GSPT funds
 - Contributions from entities that will receive a property interest

Funding Round Caps



- More expensive projects may receive less than they are eligible for
- Urban Parks cap TBD
- GA cap Based on applicant type

GA Acquisition Project Sponsor	Range of Funding Round Caps 2021-2024
Standard Municipality	\$500,000 - \$700,000
Highly or Densely Populated Municipality	\$750,000 - \$1,050,000
Urban Aid Municipality	\$1,000,000 - \$1,400,000
Standard County	\$1,000,000 - \$1,400,000
Highly Populated County	\$1,250,000 - \$1,750,000
Densely Populated County	\$1,500,000 - \$2,100,000
Nonprofit	Awards based on demonstrated need, past performance, and overall demand

Urban Parks Projects



- Local government eligible to apply
- Projects must be located in or easily accessible from an Overburdened Community Subject to Adverse Cumulative Stressors within an Urban Aid municipality
 - 100% grant funding
- Urban Parks applications rolled-over into the Green Acres round will count toward an applicant's request limit and be eligible for 100% grant funding

Public Engagement Requirements



- Must involve public in the project planning process
- Pick two out of three categories:
 - Community Survey
 - Community Meeting
 - Invitation for Community Input
- Choose methods that will most broadly and effectively engage your community

Public Engagement Requirement



To clarify:

Public Hearing ≠ Public Engagement

Public Hearing: Notice Requirements



✓ Website 15 days ahead <u>AND</u>

- Newspaper(s) 48 hours ahead
 Display ad or public notice
- $\checkmark\,$ Includes link to application information
- ✓ If remote meeting, access information included
- \checkmark Template for notices is in the application
- ✓ County projects: Notice to municipality(ies)

Public Hearing: Hearing & Minutes Requirements



- ✓ Schedule early enough to reschedule if necessary
- ✓ Held in the evening, 6:00pm or later
- \checkmark Attended by quorum of governing body
- ✓ Each public comment addressed
- ✓ Vote on resolution <u>after</u> hearing
- ✓ Complete copy of the minutes, submitted in writing <u>Draft is fine</u> as a stop-gap

Enabling Resolution



✓ Use template *without changes*

- \checkmark Amounts in resolution = request amounts
- ✓ If no loan request, list loan amount as \$0
- Match figure = Total project cost Funding request
- ✓ Urban Parks rollover additional paragraph

Ranking: What we look for



Competitive program

Higher ranking projects will incorporate
 State, Department, and Program
 Priorities, including:

- Public Engagement and Outreach
- Public Recreation Benefits
- Environmental Justice
- Community Revitalization
- Protection of Natural and Historic Resources
- o Climate Mitigation and Resilience
- Consistency with Open Space and Recreation Planning
- Stewardship of Public Funds

Additional information in application

Application Disqualification



Disqualifying circumstances (see application for full list)

- Not signed by person authorized in resolution and by Chief Financial Officer
- Public hearing/notice requirements not met
- Public engagement requirements not met

Supplemental Funding Requests



Additional funding for open project

- Must submit:
 - Supplemental Funding Request Form
 - Attachments
 - Supplemental Funding Enabling Resolution
 - Supplemental Funding Nonprofit Eligibility Certification
 - Planning Incentive / Site Specific Incentive Eligibility Certification

Submit through portal on website

Application Submission



Applicants must submit <u>complete</u> applications or supplemental funding requests by the deadline:

February 5, 2025 at midnight

- ALL application materials must be submitted by this date
 - Including public hearing minutes
- Goal: Shorter application approval timeline


