

2025 Planning Incentive and Site-Specific Incentive Eligibility Certification

To be eligible for PI or SSI funding, a local government must be collecting an open space tax for the acquisition of land for recreation and conservation purposes (see below). Local governments may instead have an alternative active, stable, and reasonably equivalent source of open space funding (see below). Eligible PI applicants must also have a Green Acres approved Open Space and Recreation Plan that will not expire before a new funding award is obligated or have submitted to Green Acres for review a draft update that meets the requirements of the *Open Space* and Recreation Plan Guidelines.

Open Space Tax or Equivalent
