Mr. Maxwell abstained from the motion.

#### 4. Old Business:

**Leasing Committee Update** 

Ms. Kelly gave a brief update on the main topics of discussion from the Leasing Committee meeting on March 4, 2020. Minutes of the meeting were available on the Division's website. A list of issues was developed and prioritized by the Committee to be addressed in 2020.

Mr. Matt Gregg was appointed to the Leasing Committee on a motion by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Maxwell. Mr. Gregg proposed an expansion on the Waretown leases to meet his needs for a deepwater overwintering lease. Mr. Normant informed him that his proposal would be discussed at the next Leasing Committee Meeting.

## 5. New Business:

2020 Vibrio Management Plan

Mr. Schuster gave an overview of the 2020 Vibrio Management Plan. There were no substantial changes compared to the 2019 plan. He stated that the minimal number of issues that were encountered last year were most likely due to post harvest handling.

## COVID\_19 Shellfish Industry Relief Discussion

Ms. Wenczel informed the Council that there were some relief funds and loans available for small businesses due to COVID-19 related hardships. These include paycheck protection programs, Economic Injury Disaster Loan, and tax credits to assist in maintaining payroll.

Mr. Cimino stated additional monies would be available through NOAA via the CARES Act for the seafood industry that would be distributed among all coastal states. New Jersey ranked ninth in total funding available. The funds would be distributed through the regional fisheries management councils based on each state's commercial fisheries related industries. Each state must develop a spending plan. New Jersey's plan would be developed by the Marine Fisheries Administration (MFA).

Mr. Maxwell inquired if the funds would get allocated by sectors. Mr. Cimino stated that the allocation of funds would be developed by the MFA based on the NMFS's formula using the most readily available data. He stated that the spending plan was actively being developed by MFA staff. All funds must be spent by September 2021.

Mr. Gaine asked what data sources would be used to assess aquaculture. Mr. Cimino believed the data would be pulled from NOAA's Fisheries of the United States Annual Report.

Executive Order 13921

Mr. Babb informed Council that a Presidential Executive Order "Promoting American Seafood Competitiveness and Economic Growth" was issued to help promote domestic seafood production. Specifically, there were sections requiring improvements and streamlining for commercial aquaculture. He stated he would send the link out to Council for review.

Aquaculture Development Plan

Mr. Gaine stated the Aquaculture Development Plan was now available and it would be beneficial to have the Council review and comment on the plan. Mr. Maxwell requested that a copy be sent to Council for review.

Lease Applications, Transfers, and Business Operations

Mr. Babb stated that the Nacote Creek office would not be processing lease applications, transfers, or biological surveys until staff were able to work out of the field station. Further, Mr. Normant and Cimino stated they have not heard any updates and were without a timeline for when normal business operations will resume at the Nacote Creek office.

Hearing no other new business, the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Maxwell.
