



Did you check out the CHANJ mapping yet?

Don't be shy...our interactive [CHANJ Web Viewer](#) is easy to use from your computer or mobile device, and it's a seriously cool tool to see where we all -- land managers, transportation planners, conservation groups, and the public -- can support wildlife habitat connectivity across New Jersey.



Where do *you* stand in NJ's connectivity puzzle? Type an address, town, or place into the "Find address" bar to get started. Or click the "My Location" button (compass) on the left side of your screen to zoom right in to your current location.

The large *Core* habitats (green) and potential wildlife movement *Corridors* (yellow-brown) shown in the CHANJ mapping are important areas to preserve or restore land. *Road Segments* that cut through those habitats (shown as bold grey-black lines) are likely to pose barriers or danger areas for animals and may be considered "opportunities" for mitigation.
