## CAPTIVE GAME POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS SPECIES APPLICATION

Important Notice Regarding Cervidae: Effective immediately under the authority of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Fish & Wildlife: Captive Game and Exotic and Nongame regulations, there is a ban until further notice on the importation of all Cervidae species into the State of New Jersey, including but not limited to: white-tailed deer, black-tailed deer, mule deer, red deer, sika deer, muntjac, reindeer, elk, and moose. This is due to the growing concern of the spread of chronic wasting disease (CWD) into wild and farmed herds in the deer family throughout the United States.

**Note:** Potentially dangerous species may not be kept as pets, for hobby purposes, or sold for any reason. No NJ resident may acquire any kind of potentially dangerous species until the application has been reviewed and the applicant receives written authorization from NJFW to obtain such species.

Submission of this application must be made in conjunction with a Captive Game Permit.

Written documentation from your local township or municipality (where the potentially dangerous species will be exhibited/housed) must be included, indicating that you may possess such animal on your premises.

Please allow a minimum of 30 days to process your permit application.
