

The 2023 Spring Turkey season brought an increase in harvests with 228 additional birds were harvested in comparison to 2022. 14 Turkey Hunting Areas (THA's) saw an increase in harvests this year. Were you able to harvest a bird this year? Did you come home with some great stories from your hunts? Did you bring out a new hunter this year? Hunter Education: Help Grow NJ Hunters!

Do you know someone who has been asking to come hunting with you or have you been putting off taking the online course or scheduling your live fire range session? Let's go through the simple rundown of how to get your firearm or bow Hunter Education card!

1st Register for our FREE online course. This is the most up to date curriculum. The workbooks and DVD's used previously are no longer valid for a live-fire range session.

2nd Upon completion of the online course, <u>register for one of our live-fire range sessions</u>. You can register for firearm, bow or both! If you register for both, please register in separate time slots for each. Live-fire range sessions will resume in late July/early August and run until November. Classes in October and November fill up quickly so please sign up early.

3rd Once you pass, you will be given your Hunter Education card. You can take this <u>to any of our agents</u> to purchase your license in person or you can <u>purchase online</u> the following week.

Free Use of NJ Ranges with Active License

Purchasing your annual hunting license allows you to use 11 of our ranges located throughout the state. Bow license holders can utilize our archery ranges and firearms license holders can utilize the firearms ranges. One person per group must have a valid current license on their person during the use of the ranges. Users must supply their own



firearms, ammunition, bows, arrows, targets, clay birds, and launchers. Backstops are available for use.

These ranges are maintained by our Lands Management team, through license sales revenue, dedicated conservation dollars and revenue from the Federal Wildlife Restoration Act generated from purchase of hunting and target shooting equipment.

All Wildlife Management Areas (WMA's) are "carry in, carry out". Make sure to check our website for the WMA regulations, current closure announcements and location addresses. Hours for use are 8:00 AM until sunset year-round. Please check the website for special hours for Black River WMA located in Morris County.

BBQ Sauce for Grilling Season



2 C ketchup
1 1/2 T Worcestershire sauce
1/3 C ACV
2 T honey (Try a local NJ honey!)
5 T brown sugar
2 1/2 t smoked paprika
1 t dry mustard
1/2 t garlic powder
1/2 t salt
1/2 t pepper

Place a pan over medium-low heat, add all ingredients and stir. Once simmering, set heat to low and simmer for 10 minutes until you reach desired thickness. Use on any of your bbq game meats!

Hunters Best Friend: Are you Ready for Fall?

As hunting season approaches, it is a good idea to make sure that your four-legged best friend is ready to go. Though it is the off season and these dogs have earned a well-deserved break, that doesn't mean there aren't certain points to focus on. Here are some things to start thinking about and ramping up in preparation for the best time of year!

- Exercise appropriate for your type of hunting
- Annual Vet check up
- Monitor healthy diet
- Check all your canine related gear
 - Including a dog first aid kit (super clot, ace bandages, gauze, saline, etc.)
- Know the location of the veterinary office closest to your hunting area
- Reinforce basic commands
- Drills
- Waterfowl dogs:
 - Practice retrieving (On land and in water)
 - Hand signals (Casting)
- Upland dogs:
 - Increase or maintain cardio
 - Pointing dogs: steadying on points
- Flushing dogs:
 - Exposure to various bird scents (Hide wings or frozen birds)

If you are interested in training your dog on one of our Wildlife Management Areas (WMA's), we have 13 Dog Training Areas that are maintained on 12 of our WMA's for public use. Check out which WMA's, the dates for training, locations and hours by heading to our website.
