WHEREAS, during his tenure with Bergen SWAN, Mark Becker worked tirelessly to protect and preserve the forested lands of Bergen County; and

WHEREAS, Bergen SWAN's diligent efforts resulted in a landmark settlement agreement being reached in 2009 between the Watershed Property Review Board, United Water New Jersey, Hackensack Riverkeeper and Bergen SWAN to address alleged violations of the Watershed restore disturbed watershed property by removing all non-native vegetation; and property and setting aside \$1 million to preserve unimproved lands within the watershed and to Moratorium Act by granting conservation easements on approximately 3,100 acres of watershed
