Support programs, spaces, and experiences that invite people to GATHER and come together.


Programs, amenities and experiences that support places to Gather and come together are important considerations whether you enjoy LSP:














LSP-South Priorities: Spaces to Play

Reinforce the importance of the GREAT LAWNS in LSP-South as significant waterfront destinations.



LSP-South Priorities: Athletics Hub

Engagement Summary:

Findings and key takeaways from May 11th's Open House:

2: Programming

Station 2 asked what types of activities people want to see in LSP-South, specifically in the Southern Athletics Hub, exploring its capacity to support athletic and recreation programming.

What We Asked:

Which iteration are you most excited by for the Athletics Hub?

What we heard:

+ Ensuring flexible public use, while also inviting tournaments / leagues to LSP for seasonal athletics, is desired (the idea of maximizing opportunities for 'free play' ('pick-up' games / family-uses) whe teams or leagues are not using is preferred.





What active recreation do you want to see at LSP-South?

What we heard:

- + Priority Field and Track programs identified included:
- **Cross Country/Trail Run #1**
- Flex/Multi-Use Fields #2
- Soccer Fields #3
- Track + Field #4
- Baseball Field #5 Football #6 and Softball #7
- + Priority Court and Racket sports identified included:
- > Multi-Sport Courts #1 **Beach Volleyball #2**
- Pickle Ball Courts #3
- **Badminton #4**
- Tennis Courts #5 Basketball #6 and Volleyball Courts #7

Additional athletic/sport/active recreation that received high priority were: Bike Path, Pump Track, Skate Park (Plaza/Bowl), Bouldering, Mountain Biking, Rock Climbing, and Parkour / Free Running.

Key Themes / Takeaways:

+ Desire to incorporate active recreation and athletic fields into the 'park atmosphere' with flexible alternatives that allow both park users and teams to enjoy spaces; + Consensus that ideas that 'serve the most people' (creating a balance for various users) is preferred - specifically understanding complementary use opportunities




