The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is sending this listserv as a reminder that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:26F-7.3(c), electronic submission of Unregulated Heating Oil Tank (UHOT) forms, applications, and documents will become mandatory on **January 16, 2022**. This affects UHOT Remedial Action Reports (including required laboratory data reports and any other required documentation), UHOT On-Scene Coordinator Discharge Authorization, UHOT Permit by Rule, and UHOT Amended NFA requests. The Department will no longer accept these forms, applications, and documents on paper after that date.
