Subject Update: Linking a Confirmed Discharge Notification or an Underground Storage Tank Notice of Intent to Close to an Existing Case

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department), Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) announces that the Confirmed Discharge Notification (CDN) and Underground Storage Tank Notice of Intent to Close (NOI) online services will no longer allow the user to link new cases to an existing case. Users have been incorrectly linking a new discharge or a Notice of Intent to Close an Underground Storage Tank to existing cases using the online service, leading to the need for data cleanup.

Beginning May 1, 2024, a new case will be created whenever a CDN is filed, and for an NOI if the UST(s) are out of compliance. Please refer to the Activity Merge Requirements Guidance at <https://dep.nj.gov/srp/guidance/#amr> if a merge of cases is desired.
