**Subject** Updated Technical Guidance for the Attainment of Remediation Standards and Site-Specific

Criteria now available!

Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) is pleased to announce that the Technical Guidance for the Attainment of Remediation Standards and Site-Specific Criteria has been revised from Version 2.0 to Version 3.0. This guidance was developed to aid the investigator with demonstrating compliance with the applicable remediation standards when conducting a remedial action pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7.26E. Significant revisions include new sections on addressing historic fill and the development of functional areas in conjunction with an alternate remediation standard, a consistent approach to addressing non-detect values in data sets where compliance averaging is applied, and a new appendix that describes the data deliverables to accompany reports where compliance averaging is selected as a remedial action.
