Subject September 17 FSPM Ch. 3 and Attainment of Remediation Standards and Site-Specific Criteria

Training

Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) will be providing detailed training on Chapter 3 of the Field Sampling Procedures Manual (FSPM, 2024 Edition) and the Technical Guidance for the Attainment of Remediation Standards and Site-Specific Criteria, Version 3.0.

The information in the FSPM provides Licensed Site Remediation Professionals (LSRPs) and environmental professionals with tools to promote consistency and accuracy when environmental samples are collected. Chapter 3; Contaminants of Emerging Concern, was a new chapter added to address the constant changes in these emerging contaminants. This training session will cover the topics in Chapter 3: Contaminants of Emerging Concern, 2024 Edition, and the new PFAS Sampling Fact Sheet.

The <u>Technical Guidance for the Attainment of Remediation Standards and Site-Specific Criteria</u> has been updated from Version 2.0 to 3.0. This guidance was developed to aid the investigator with demonstrating compliance with the applicable remediation standards when conducting a remedial action pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26E. This training will highlight the revisions that were made.

The virtual training will be held on Tuesday, September 17, 2024, from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m via GoToWebinar (see registration details below). The end time of the training may be extended for additional content which is still being developed.
