Subject Instructions for the LSRP Supplemental Certifications for Initial Soil and Initial Ground Water Remedial Action Permit (RAP) Applications are now available!

Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) is pleased to announce the availability of the Instructions for the LSRP Supplemental Certification for Initial Soil RAP Application and the Instructions for the LSRP Supplemental Certification for Initial Ground Water RAP Application for Monitored Natural Attenuation (MNA).

These instructions will assist the person responsible for conducting the remediation and the Licensed Site Remediation Professional in determining if a permit application is eligible for LSRP Supplemental Certification submission and how to complete the certification form. These instructions were reviewed by the RAP stakeholder group and address frequently asked questions.
