**Subject** Updated Remedial Action Permit (RAP) Transfer/Change of Ownership Application and Instructions now available!

Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) has posted an updated RAP Transfer/Change of Ownership Application and Instructions. The form and instructions were reviewed by the RAP stakeholder group. Significant changes include the following:

- Section I. Person Responsible for Conducting the Remediation Information and Certification: removed since it is not needed for property transfer/changes;
- Section F. Financial Assurance (FA): removed unnecessary questions and added instructions to attach an up-to-date Remediation Cost Review and RFS/FA Form, including a detailed cost estimate, if applicable;
- Section D. Former Property Owner (Transferor) Information and Certification: combines contact information and information and certification sections; and
- Section E. New/Current Property Owner (Transferee) Information and Certification: combines contact information and information and certification sections.
