Contaminated Site Remediation & Redevelopment (CSRR) is pleased to announce a new policy, titled, "Using NJDEP CSRR Financial Relief Criteria for Spill Fund Damage Claims and Publicly Administered Remediations" available at: [https://dep.nj.gov/wp-content/uploads/srp/financial\\_relief\\_criteria.pdf](https://dep.nj.gov/wp-content/uploads/srp/financial_relief_criteria.pdf).

On April 10, 2024, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) announced the final National Primary Drinking Water Regulation (NPDWR) for six (6) Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) compounds. Based on both the Federally proposed and promulgated NPDWR standards and current draft IRIS toxicology data, CSRR is implementing a policy such that if there are exceedances of the values presented in the below table under the column titled "NJDEP CSRR Financial Relief Criteria" in a private potable well, the property owner may be eligible for financial relief for installation of a treatment system or alternate water source, as determined by CSRR.

Hexafluoropropylene oxide-dimer acid (HFPO-DA or GenX)	N/A	10.
Perfluorohexanesulfonic acid (PFHxS)	N/A	10.
Perfluorobutane sulfonate (PFBS)	N/A	2,000.
