Fact Sheet for Requesting DEP Guidance on Public Water System Monitoring during an Emergency



Public water systems experiencing challenges with sampling or analysis due to the availability of staff or laboratories, or the inability to enter homes/buildings for distribution system sampling may request the DEP to use discretion to review modifications to sampling requirements due to emergency situations. Be advised that some instances may <u>not</u> need DEP review and approval. It is important to read the below scenarios to determine if a request is applicable.

Scenario	Action
You need to deviate from the pre-approved distribution system sampling locations but can collect the required number of samples and they are representative. You need to modify your Revised Total Coliform Rule, Disinfectant By-Product Rule, or Water Quality Parameter Sampling Plan to reflect alternate sampling locations.	You do NOT need DEP approval. Visit our website to view additional guidance, memorandums, and Best Management Practices for more detailed information on appropriate alternate sampling locations and guidance for modifying your Sampling Plan.
Your water system is not in operation for the quarter due to closure of the facility.	You do NOT need DEP approval. Email <u>watersupply@dep.nj.gov</u> with "Water System Out of Service" in the subject line
You cannot collect the required number of samples for a specific parameter (due to lab availability, staffing issues, access issues, etc.)	DEP approval is needed * Read our Best Management Practices for more details. Complete a Request for DEP Guidance on Public Water System Monitoring Due to an Emergency in its entirely and email it to watersupply@dep.nj.gov with "Request for DEP Guidance on Monitoring" in the subject line.
You are having difficulty operating your system or complying with other related licensed operator requirements (i.e. full-time licensed operator requirements, staffing, licensed operator access and/or availability etc.).
