



AMENDMENT TO THE ATLANTIC COUNTY WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice

Take notice that on **JAN 12 1998**, pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Atlantic County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department). This amendment, **modifying the Egg Harbor Township Wastewater Management Plan**, was submitted on behalf of **Seaview Corporation**. It extends the sewer service area, within Egg Harbor Township, to Block 9502, Lots 31 and 33 (formerly Block 5F, Lots 3 and 141). The expansion of the sewer service area will serve no more than three planned single family homes. Utilizing the Egg Harbor Township Municipal Utilities Authority collection system, the maximum projected wastewater planning flow would be 900 gallons per day with treatment at the Atlantic County Utilities Authority (ACUA) - City Island Sewage Treatment Plant (New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit #NJ0024473) located in Atlantic City. The ACUA - City Island Sewage Treatment Plant discharges into the Atlantic Ocean. A backup water supply well will also be installed to provide water to the proposed lots.

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues will be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which were not reviewed in conjunction with this amendment but which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under Federal or State statutes or rules.
