AMENDMENT TO THE LOWER DELAWARE WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice

Take notice that on MAR 3 0 1999, pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Lower Delaware Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department).

This amendment submitted on behalf of the Woodstown Sewerage Authority (SA), amends the Woodstown SA Wastewater Management Plan. This amendment will increase the sewer service area by 9.9 acres in Pilesgrove Township. The amendment will also transfer 6,000 gallons per day (gpd) of flow from the future allocation of commercial/institutional uses Woodstown in to the future allocation commercial/institutional uses in Pilesgrove Township so as not to increase the overall flow. A Cycle-Let system will accommodate a shopping center at Block 64, Lots 5, 6, 7 and 9 located at the intersection of Harding Highway (State Highway Route 40) and State Highway Route 45 in Pilesgrove Township, Salem County, New Jersey.

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues will be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which were not reviewed in conjunction with this amendment but which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under Federal or State statutes or rules.
