AMENDMENT TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice

Take notice that on pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Monmouth County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department. The amendment modifies the Township of Middletown Sewerage Authority (TOMSA) Wastewater Management Plan by expanding the sewer service area of the TOMSA Sewage Treatment Plant to include a 48.69 acre parcel located at Block 486, Lots 17 through 22, just south of Kings Highway East in Middletown Township. The parcel includes a small portion of the Chapel Hill Historical District on part of Lots 21 and 22 which presently receives sewer service. The remaining area of the amendment will service 30 proposed single family homes, each with individual grinder pump stations. The maximum amount of projected wastewater flow from the project site is 12,000 gallons per day.

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues will be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which were not reviewed in conjunction with this amendment but which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under federal or State statutes or rules.
