OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES Notice of New Law Changing State Reporting Requirements

Take notice that a new law, P.L.1991, c.164, was enacted this June 19, 1991, directing that all official reports and other documents of State officers and agencies required by law to be sent to the Legislature, be sent only to the Senate President, General Assembly Speaker and the Director of the Office of Public Information (OPI), in the Office of Legislative Services.

Under the law, one copy shall be sent to the President, one copy to the Speaker, and five copies to the Director of Public Information. The Director of OPI will prepare a notice containing the publication's title, authoring agency and a brief synopsis. This information will then be disseminated to the members of the Legislature. Interested members can request copies of the complete publication from OPI.

This law does not apply to reporting requirements specified in the State Constitution or information required by law to be submitted to the Legislative Counsel, State Auditor, Legislative Budget and Finance Officer, the Joint Oversight Committee, or the Joint Legislative Committee on Ethical Standards. It also does not affect N.J.S.A. 52:14-25.1, which requires that 75 copies of all official State documents be submitted to the state library.

DIVISION OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES Notice of Action on Petition for Rulemaking N.J.A.C. 7:26-2.13 and 7:26-6.3

Petitioner: New Jersey Auto and Metal Recyclers Association.

Take notice that on March 11, 1991, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) and on March 13, 1991, the Board of Public Utilities received a petition for rulemaking concerning the amendment of the definition of Type 27 waste and the amendment of the rule which exempts certain classes of waste from interdistrict and intradistrict waste flow orders. Public notice of this petition was published in the July 15, 1991 New Jersey Register at 23 N.J.R. 2187(c).

In accordance with N.J.A.C. 1:30-3.6 and after thorough review of the petition, the Department has determined that the matter will require further deliberation and consideration in order to analyze fully the physical and chemical characteristics of Auto Shredder Residue through data supplied by the Petitioner's members using current State and Federal analytical test methods as instructed by the Department's Division of Solid Waste Management. Upon the conclusion of the Department's deliberations, on or about July 31, 1991, the decision will be mailed to the petitioners and published in a future New Jersey Register.

A copy of this notice had been mailed to the petitioner, as required by N.J.A.C. 1:30-3.6.

Amendment to the Cape May County Water Quality Management Plan

Public Notice

Take notice that an amendment to the Cape May County Water Quality Management (WQM) Plan has been proposed to disconnect the

nine U.S. Coast Guard housing units in Upper Township, Cape May County, from the New Jersey Marine Sciences Consortium's (NJMSC) sewage treatment plant (STP) and treat the wastewater on site via an on-site groundwater disposal system. The average population of the nine homes is 24 and the average daily flow is 2,400 gallons per day. If a groundwater discharge is found not to be feasible, the housing units will remain connected to the NJMSC STP.

This notice is being given to inform the public that a plan amendment has been developed for the Cape May County WQM Plan. All information dealing with the aforesaid WQM Plan and the proposed amendment is located at the Cape May County Planning Department, 14-34 Mechanic Street, Cape May Court House, New Jersey 08210, and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), Division of Water Resources, Bureau of Water Quality Planning, 401 East State Street, 3rd Floor, CN-029, Trenton, New Jersey 08625. It is available for inspection between 8:30 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. An appointment to inspect the documents may be arranged by calling the Cape May County Planning Department at (609) 465-1083 or the Bureau of Water Quality Planning at (609) 633-7026.

Interested persons may submit written comments on the amendment to Mr. Grover Webber, Cape May County Planning Department at the address cited above. A copy of the comments should be sent to Mr. Edward Frankel of the Bureau of Water Quality Planning, at the NJDEP address cited above. All comments must be submitted wihin 30 days of the date of this public notice. All comments submitted by interested persons in response to this notice, within the time limit, shall also be considered by NJDEP with respect to the amendment request.

Any interested persons may request in writing that NJDEP hold a nonadversarial public hearing on the amendment or extend the public comment period in this notice up to 30 additional days. These requests must state the nature of the issues to be raised at the proposed hearing or state the reasons why the proposed extension is necessary. These requests must be submitted within 30 days of this public notice to Mr. Frankel at the NJDEP address cited above. If a public hearing for the amendment is held, the public comment period in this notice shall be extended 15 days after the close of the public hearing.

Amendment to the Ocean County Water Quality Management Plan

Public Notice

Take notice that on July 3, 1991, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq. and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Ocean County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department. This amendment approves a Wastewater Management Plan for Little Egg Harbor Township. The plan delineates the limits of the existing sewer service areas, proposed sewer service areas, individual subsurface sewage disposal areas, as well as parks, preserves, and other environmentally sensitive areas. The wastewater flows are treated at the Ocean County Southern Wastewater Pollution Control Facility.

Amendment to the Monmouth County Water Quality Management Plan

Public Notice

Take notice that on June 17, 1991, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Monmouth County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department. This amendment identifies an on-site treatment facility discharging 5,900 gallons per day to ground water. The project is located at Lot 26, Block 911 in Wall Township.
