REVISION TO THE TRI-COUNTY WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

TAKE NOTICE that on pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5, a revision (Program Interest No.: 435433; Activity No.: REV160003) to the Tri-County Water Quality Management Plan (WQMP) was adopted by the Department. This revision modifies the Gloucester County Utilities Authority (GCUA) Wastewater Management Plan (WMP). The revision addresses the following existing development located in West Deptford Township: a restaurant, an age-restricted apartment development, an age-restricted condominium development, a retail/professional building, an office building, two age-restricted single family home developments, a golf course maintenance building, an indoor tennis center, a stadium sports complex and a community center. These developments are currently connected to the GCUA sewage treatment plant (NJ0024686) located in West Deptford Township but were inadvertently omitted from the sewer service area when the GCUA WMP was adopted on December 10, 2008. The above listed developments received local approvals from the West Deptford Township Planning Board from 2000 through 2004; sewer extension approvals from GCUA from 2000 through 2007, and Treatment Works Approvals (TWA's) from the Department from 2000 through 2008. No new construction or flows are proposed beyond that which was previously approved for sewer service in the above referenced approvals. A list of the lots and blocks covered by this revision is as follows: Block 323/Lots 3.03, 3.31; Block 328/Lots 3.11, 3.12, 7 (portion), 7.02 (portion), 7.05 (portion), 7.07 (portion); Blocks 328.03-328.09 (all lots); Block 328.11/Lot 1 (portion). This revision is being adopted in accordance with N.J.A.C.7:15-3.5(b)1, which allows revisions in order to correct, clarify, or update erroneous, unclear, or outdated statements in an areawide WQMP.
