REVISION TO THE UPPER DELAWARE WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

PUBLIC NOTICE

Take Notice that on DEC 2 1 2015

pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A.58:11A-1 et seq, and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5, a revision to the Upper Delaware Water Quality Management Plan (WQMP) was adopted by the Department. This revision updates the sewer service area (SSA) mapping for those portions of the Gridley Circle and Drake Court developments in Holland Township, Hunterdon County having sewage flows conveyed by pump station and force main to the associated treatment facility. The developments were constructed in the mid-1980's and fully served by the Milford Borough sewer treatment plant as of October 11, 2006, the date the Department adopted its State-wide SSA GIS coverage; however, the portion of the development subject to this amendment was inadvertently left out of that mapping. Being that the developments were in existence and fully served by sewer at the time of the aforementioned prior Water Quality Management plan amendment, this project or activity qualifies as a revision under N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5(b)1.i.

In order to maintain consistency with the proposed mapping included in the draft Highlands-conforming Holland Township Wastewater Management Plan (WMP) currently in development, this revision adopts sewer service area as follows:

For lots less than 1 acre in area, the entire parcel was included in SSA. The affected parcels are Lots 1.08, 1.09, 1.10, 1.11, 1.20, 1.21, 1.22, 1.23, 1.24, 1.25, 1.27, 1.28, 1.29, 1.30, 1.31,1.32, 1.33, 1.34, 1.35, 1.36, 1.40, 1.41 and 1.42, all of

Block 10; and Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30, all of Block 10.01.

For lots 1 acre or more in area, only the footprint of the sewage-generating structure has been included in the sewer service area. The affected parcels are Lots 1.04, 1.12, 1.13, 1.14, 1.15, 1.16, 1.17, 1.18, 1.19, 1.26, 1.37, 1.38 and 1.39, all of Block 10; and Lots 8 and 11, all of Block 10.01.
